

<u>Career Planning Workshop for Researchers</u> 'Take Charge of Your Career'

Overview: This workshop teaches researchers what it takes to be strategic and proactive in planning and developing a career, both inside and beyond academia.

The agenda addresses how to explore career choices based on individual strengths and preferences. It explores how to identify 'what's out there' in the employment market, and how participants can build the contacts and skills they need to pursue their preferences successfully.

Workshop aims: The training introduces the strategies and tools that researchers need to take effective charge of their own career development. It is a highly interactive course that includes both participant-specific mapping of career paths and plan implementation exercises.

The program also introduces the principles of 'Mastermind' mentoring that participants can use as a platform for creating their own peer mentor groups beyond the workshop.

Format	 The highly interactive format involves short presentations, individual exercises, small 'breakout'-style discussions and Q&A sessions The event is capped at 25 participants to allow for optimal engagement
Mode of delivery	Delivered virtually via Zoom over two days, or in person over a single day
Duration and timing	 Full-day equivalent: The workshop contains 2x 3.5hrs core + 0.5hr voluntary Q&A sessions 2 successive days preferred for the virtual option (though flexibility is possible)
Core content summary	Presentations, exercises and group discussions around the following topics: Session 1: Know your capabilities and preferences, and explore your choices Session 2: Create your career plan Session 3: Build your networks; develop your profile Session 4: Develop and 'sell' the skills that win you jobs
